

## Pupil Premium Grant Impact 2017-18

Golden Flatts Primary School currently has 59 (53%) pupils receiving Pupil Premium (PP) funding.

### Summary of PP 2017-2018

This compares the school's performance against national benchmarks and highlights the impact of the spend.

The spend stipulated in 2017-18 PP Strategy was as follows:

- To help fund the school structure which is seen as most desirable for assisting teaching and learning - maintaining small class sizes and single year groups
- Part funding of enhanced SALT services
- Use of Lexia reading intervention to close the gaps in reading attainment for selected children. Progress data shows that across all year groups Lexia has made a positive impact on reading with all children improving in fluency in reading and some making accelerated progress in reading.
- After school tuition – analysis of intervention data shows the following:

- The percentages in Reading and Writing tuition who made less than expected progress represents 1 child (SI), the same child in each group. He has been referred via Learning Support for further investigation of his needs around Literacy. The same child accessed maths tuition also but did make expected progress.

- To improve the emotional wellbeing of selected children through 1-1 weekly counselling sessions with Place 2 Be and self-referral lunchtime Place 2 Talk sessions.
- Social inclusion assistant to support attendance. Attendance has improved marginally over the year. Going forward we will look at further interventions to support our ongoing aim of improving attendance.
