

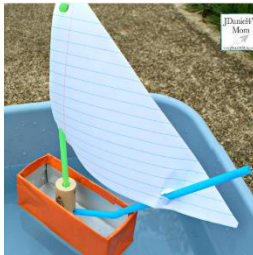


## "Why is water wet?"



### Creative

- Your child could build a boat using recyclable materials - what happens when you put it in water? Do different recyclable materials work better in water than others?
- They could investigate floating and sinking with a variety of objects.
- Your child could paint a picture of a boat out at sea. They could make a wave pattern using cardboard 'combs'.



### Talk

- Talk about a raindrops journey from cloud to sea.
- Watch film clips of thunder and rain storms and talk about what they can see and hear.
- Encourage your child to imagine that they are on a boat in that weather. You could talk about the boat rocking, huge waves crashing, being wet... How might they feel?



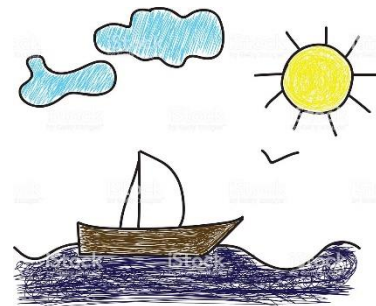
### Maths

- Your child could sing 1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive. Encourage them to show the number using their fingers as they are singing.
- Try making boats using bottle or jar lids with numbered sails and have a boat race!



### Mark making/Writing

- You could help your child research different types of boats online.
- Encourage your child to talk about their favourite boat and why.
- They could then draw a picture of their favourite boat.
