

"Why is water wet?"



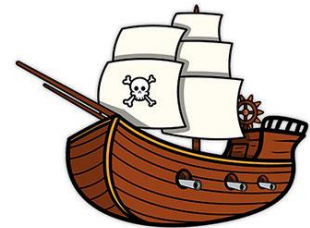
Creative

- Try creating a pirate role play mask using a paper plate and paints.
- Your child could make a large scale pirate ship using cardboard boxes.
- They could also use paper plates to create their own parrot.



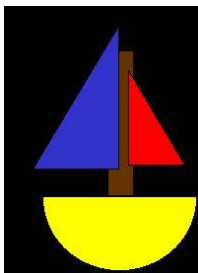
Talk

- Talk about pirates - what does your child already know about them?
- You could use the internet to research pirate ships. What does your child notice about them? What do they all have in common? Your child could learn the real names of the different parts of the ship.



Maths

- Your child could use paper shapes to create a pirate ship picture. Can they name the shapes?
- You could collect stones and paint them to make numbered treasure- or make salt dough treasure if you have the ingredients! Can your child recognise the numbers? Can they order the treasure by number?



Mark making/Writing

- Encourage your child to draw a picture of a pirate. Can they hear the initial sound 'p' in pirate? Can they write it?
- Your child could also try drawing their own treasure map - remember 'x' marks the spot!



Please continue to encourage your child to practise writing their name, read a story and sing nursery rhymes daily.
